Slap Injury	Guests instructed & demonstrated in correct jumping technique. Jumps limited to 5m height maximum. Technique reduces risk to arms and face slapping water	3x1=4		
Obstructions in water	Instructor to swim the pool to check landing area and demonstrate jump first as final check	4x1=3		
Cold water shock: injury or illness caused by involuntary response to sudden immersion in cold water	Rock jump to take place at end of Gorge Walking session, which gradually builds up immersion in cold water over approximately 40 minutes. All participants wear PFDs as specified in the Generic Watersports Risk Assessment.	4x1=4
